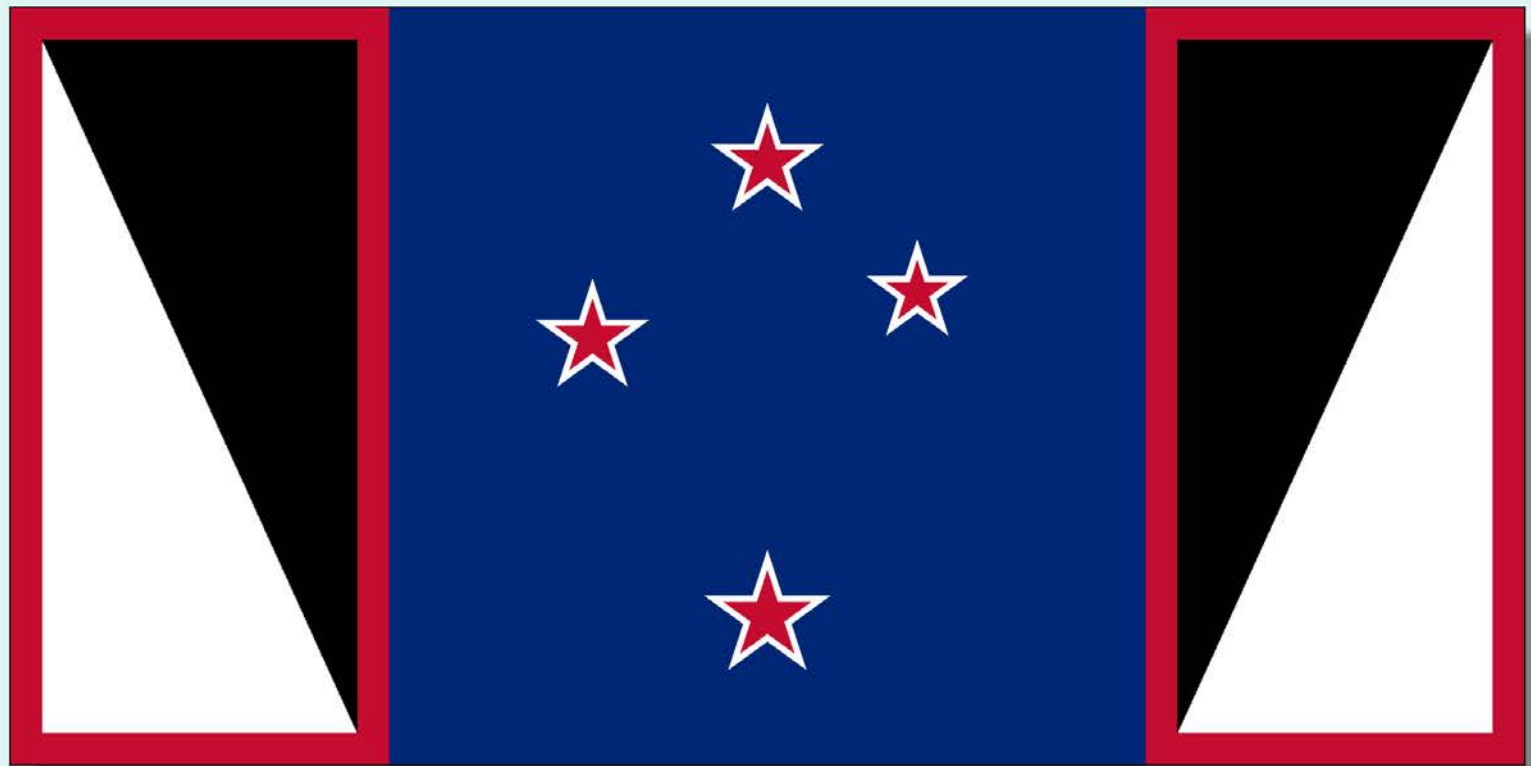


“Nek Minnit”, an alternative New Zealand national flag design

Time flies, and things can change rapidly. One minute, the 'Nek Minnit' flag design may seem to display only black-and-white triangles at its hoist and at its fly areas, but the next minute, the respective sets of triangles may seem to form the capitalised letters 'N' and 'Z', whether the flag is viewed from its obverse side or its reverse side. The sets of triangles are set within wide red borders that each extend one-quarter of the length of the flag, leaving a half-length centre area, which for the national flag has a blue field and the traditional New Zealand-style red-and-white stars of the Southern Cross, and which for the remaining flags and ensigns of the nation will readily accommodate other required field colours and symbols as shown above. Always displaying the official national colours of black-and-white, the Nek Minnit flag design will be a boldly distinctive and easily identified symbol of EnZed, no matter the wind conditions nor the distance from which it is viewed.
