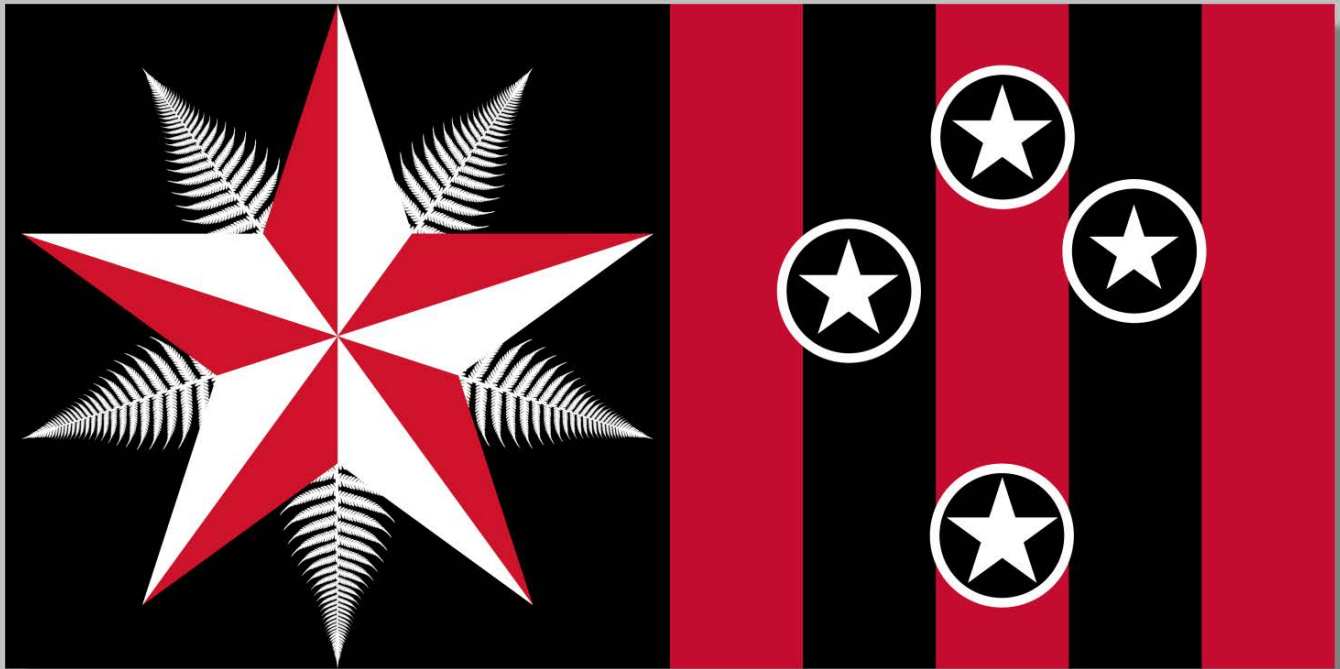


**"New Zealand Demesne", a New Zealand national flag design

The hoist of this flag uses a 5-point, raised-look red-and-white star to represent the main areas of the Realm of New Zealand: NZ proper, Tokelau, Niue, the Cook Islands, and the Ross Dependency. Echoing this numerical symbolism is a background 'star' of five silver fern fronds, as well as a five-stripe red-and-black fly. Completing the design is the traditional New Zealand Southern Cross, although in this case it has been rendered as high-contrast white stars on black circles, further emphasised by circular white fimbriations. Departing from the traditional red-white-and-blue, this red-white-and-black flag will be truly distinctive.
