Inspired by the original 'New Zild' flag design, this variant sports sixteen red-white-and-blue, Escheresque blocks, which have been arranged vertically at its hoist. The blocks numerically symbolise all of the official regions of New Zealand, and together with their black field they occupy one-quarter of the length of the flag. For the national flag, the remaining threequarters of the flag also has a black field, upon which a white-starred version of the New Zealand-style Southern Cross appears, whilst for the remaining flags and ensigns of the nation, this large area readily accommodates other field colours and symbols as required, as has been illustrated above. This visually striking flag design will be easily recognised from any distance and in any wind, and always with the full complement of New Zealand national colours showing at its hoist.
