
"Under the Milky Way Tonight", a New Zealand flag design (suggested derivative flags and ensigns are also depicted)



Spanning the full length of the flag are sixteen red-and-blue stripes, representing the official regions of New Zealand proper. A distinctive black-and-white overlay in the hoist, consisting of a silver fern frond surrounded by a circle of sixteen stars, is suggestive of a starry night sky. The diagonal slant of the silver fern frond toward the upper hoist edge ensures that most or all of the fern will be visible when the flag is in windless conditions, and the stripes will make the design recognisable in any wind. The overlay in the flag's hoist might in time become as iconic a symbol of New Zealand as the Southern Cross in the flag's fly.
